WHAT MEN'S CLUB MEANS TO ME

The South Jersey Men's Club has been described as a synagogue Men's Club without a synagogue. It provides an opportunity to help our members give back by providing a vehicle to engage in activities that positively affect the greater community. I'm proud that much of our programming enriches our members with knowledge and an appreciation of Jewish culture and life. It also serves to build and maintain a closer connection to Israel. I particularly enjoy the socialization events, such as trips and our year-round monthly breakfast meetings, which bring together members from various backgrounds. It's not unusual for half or more of our members to attend the meetings, even when the "snowbirds" are out of town. It's meaningful that the structure and culture of our Club keep our involved members from becoming burned out. I'm also proud that our member retention rate is very high and that a majority participates and volunteers on a regular basis. Eight different members served on our Torch Award committee in 2023. The result is, that since our beginning in 1991, the SJMC has earned more Torch Awards than almost every other club in North America. The South Jersey Men's Club means a great deal to me.
